Deacon Let us together affirm the faith of the Church.

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the almighty,

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,

he came down from heaven,
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary
and became truly human.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.

he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory to judge
the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

The Exhortation and Examination

Katy Lambert stands before the Bishop, and the people sit.

Bishop

Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ
lived and died as the servant of God.
All who follow him are called to serve God in the world, setting
forward Christ's kingdom
through the power of the Spirit.

Now Christ has called you, Katy, to the office of deacon.
You are to be an ambassador of Christ,
serving God as you serve others in Jesus' name.
Proclaim the good news of God's love,
so that many may be moved to faith and repentance,
and hearts be opened to do justice,
love mercy, and walk humbly in the presence of God.

Let the transforming love of Jesus be known to all
among whom you live and work.

Strengthen the faithful, teach the young,
search out the careless and indifferent.

Encourage the members of Christ's body by word and example,
ministering among the sick, the needy
and all who are oppressed or in trouble.

Together with your bishop, priest and people,
you are to take your place in public worship,
assist in the administration of the sacraments,
and play your part in the life and councils of the Church.

You are to preach the word of God
in the place to which you are licensed,
and to pray and work for peace and justice in the world.

As a deacon,
you are to model your life according to the Word of God.

Study the scriptures, reflecting with God's people
upon their meaning, that all may be equipped
to live out God's truth in the world.

Put away all that does not make for holiness of life.

Be faithful in prayer, that you may have strength to run the race that is set before you.

And now, in order that this congregation may understand your intention, and so that your public profession may strengthen your resolve, answer clearly these questions, which I ask you in the name of God and of the Church.

Bishop Katy Keese Lambert,
do you believe that you are truly called to this order and ministry of deacons, being moved by the Holy Spirit to serve God and build up his people, according to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ and the order of this Anglican Church of Australia?

Katy *I do believe I am called to this ministry.*

Bishop Do you wholeheartedly accept the canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as given by the Spirit to convey in many and varied ways the revelation of God which is fulfilled in our Lord Jesus Christ?

Katy *I do accept them.*

Bishop Will you take your part in reading the holy Scriptures in the church, in teaching the doctrine of Christ, and in assisting the priest to teach the doctrine of Christ and administer the sacraments?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you be diligent in prayer, and in the study of the holy Scriptures? Will you undertake such other studies as will help you in your ministry?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you strive to shape your own life, and that of your household, according to the way of Christ?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you constantly seek the help of the Holy Spirit to use and develop God's gifts to you, so that you may serve all by word and deed?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you promote unity, peace and love among all Christian people, especially among those with whom you serve God, encouraging and enabling them to fulfil their ministries?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you seek to set forward Christ's kingdom in the world, working for reconciliation, peace and justice?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop Will you accept the order and discipline of the Anglican Church of Australia, submitting yourself to the lawful authority of your bishop and others set over you in the Church?

Katy *I will, by God's grace.*

Bishop May God who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

The Laying on of Hands

Katy kneels before Bishop Matt, who says

Bishop Blessed are you, Lord our God!
In your infinite love you set us free
to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son.
Though he was rich, for our sake Christ became poor.
Taking the form of a servant, he humbled himself,
and gave his life a ransom for many.
Exalted as Lord of all,
he poured out the gifts of the Spirit,
to equip the saints for the work of ministry,
and to build up the body of Christ.

And now we give you thanks that you have called
this your servant Katy Keese
to the ministry of deacons in your Church.

The bishop lays hands on the head of Katy, and says

Send down the Holy Spirit upon your servant Katy Keese,
whom we set apart by the laying on of our hands,
for the office and work of a deacon in your Church.

The Reverend Katy Lambert is appropriately vested.

The Bishop delivers to her a copy of the New Testament, saying

The Greeting of Peace

The Bishop presents the newly ordained deacon to the congregation.

You call out those who will serve you as deacons,

and commission them for the service of others,

that the pattern of Christ's rule may be seen among us.

Therefore, with them, and with all your saints

who have served you in every age,

we give thanks and lift our voices

to proclaim the glory of your name.

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Bishop Merciful God, we thank you
for these gifts of your creation, this bread and wine,
and we pray that by your Word and Holy Spirit,
we who eat and drink them
may be partakers of Christ's body and blood.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread;
and when he had given you thanks
he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Take, eat. This is my body given for you.
Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup,
and again giving thanks
he gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Drink from this, all of you.
This is my blood of the new covenant
shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

proclaiming his offering of himself
made once for all upon the cross,
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,

Bishop Renew us by your Holy Spirit,

into the joy of your eternal kingdom;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
with whom, and in whom,
in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,

About the Ordinand

Katy grew up on the beautiful South Coast of New South Wales, the youngest of four siblings and daughter of an Anglican priest and an early childhood teacher. Throughout school, Katy was active in her local ecumenical youth group, leading small groups, lunchtime prayer meetings and outreach events. Katy moved to Canberra to complete her undergraduate degree in Development Studies and Political Science. During her studies she was a part of a “fresh expressions” Anglican church, and an outreach ministry in a local high school.

After a short dabble working in policy and politics, she began working with refugees and asylum seekers. Alongside her employment Katy established a youth group and organised the occasional 24-hour prayer event. Katy’s love for Jesus and justice led her to devote 6 months in a house of prayer in the USA as a Nightwatch (midnight to 6am) Intercessory Missionary. Following a short return to Australia, she offered herself to the work of International Justice Mission to end violence against the poor. She re-packed her bags and headed to Ghana for 12 months to help a local team end forced child labour on Volta Lake. Through these years, Katy worshipped and served alongside brothers and sisters in Christ from a range of different cultures and denominations and tried to embrace what the diversity had to offer her knowledge and experience of God and his kingdom.

Katy’s experience and skills soon led her to West Yorkshire in England, where she lived for three years prior to moving to Bendigo. There she worked with refugees, studied theology, served in the local CoE church in prayer, outreach, and discipleship ministries, and established a Community Support Team when COVID-19 hit. By the grace of God, Katy hopes to continue to offer herself in service of God and his people, to see God’s kingdom come in every community on earth, with young and old living life in the fullness of God’s love, and together growing in the knowledge and experience of who He is.
